Annual Meeting Tour Options Create Temptations in Tampa!

George Haase has raised the standard for our annual meeting planning expectations. To get you thinking "Tampa 2010," here's a preview of the activities already being planned for you.

TAMPA CITY TOUR and The American Victory Ship and Lunch October 7, 2010 Return to the Victorian era in the lavishly furnished H. B. Plant Museum located on the University of Tampa Campus. It's located in the former Tampa Bay Hotel built in 1891 as a palatial resort. This elegant structure stands on 150 tropical acres overlooking the Hillsborough River. The Hotel was built and furnished by railroad tycoon Henry Bradford

Plant. Recapture another era in this opulent Victorian winter resort. Modeled after the Alhambra Palace in Granada Spain, it is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Visit historic Ybor City where the heart of the Latin community evolved. Vicente Martinez Ybor and other Havana cigar makers brought

Chaplain's Corner

Association Loses a Special Friend and Long-Time Member of the Coral Sea Family

CHAPLAIN Captain Stanford E. Linzey, age 89, passed away February 4, 2010 in San Diego, California. He resided in Escondido with his wife, Verna M. Hall Linzey. He was born October 13, 1920 in Houston, Texas to Stanford Linzey and Eva Fay Westphal Linzey. In the late 1940's while attending college and seminary, he pioneered and built the church in El Cajon on the corner of Avocado and Washington Streets, then called "The Evangelistic Tabernacle," an Assemblies of God Church.

Chaplain Linzey served in the U.S. Navy eight years as an enlisted musician, then served as a Navy Chaplain 20 years, being the first Chaplain representing the Assemblies of God denomination in the regular Navy. Captain



Linzey retired in 1974 and continued preaching the Gospel as an evangelistic speaker and author.

He served in World War II, and was a survivor of the USS Yorktown that sunk during the Battle of Midway. His book, "God Was at Midway," told the story of his experiences during that battle.

He earned the B.A. and Th.B. degrees from San Diego Baptist Bible College and Seminary; Master of Divinity from the American Baptist Seminary of the West in Berkeley, CA. He studied at the Harvard Divinity School. He earned the Doctor of Ministry Degree from Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, CA. He was an ordained minister with the Assemblies of God denomination, a member of the San Diego Christian Writers Guild, a member of the Northern California Christian Businessmen's Fellowship, and the Chaplain of the USS Coral Sea Alumni Association.

Ed. Note—The Coral Sea Breeze extends sincere condolences to the family of Chaplain Linzey, who served many years as Association chaplain. His service to the Association included a regular 'Chaplain's Corner' column in this newsletter.

their factories and a new culture to Tampa, becoming "the Cigar Capital of the World." Tour the old Ferlita Bakery,

now converted to the Ybor City State Museum, featuring the story of immigrant families making their way in



a new land. Visit a turn-of-thecentury cigar worker's house and enjoy lunch at a Cuban Restaurant in Ybor City.

Other highlights include a drive along exclusive Bayshore Boulevard, and the waterfront area -- home to the Tampa Convention Center, Forum, Cruise Terminals, Shoppes at Channelside, the Florida Aguarium and Harbour Island.

We will round out the tour in Channelside with a visit to the American Victory Ship. This stop allows visitors to view firsthand the on-going work to restore an icon of America's merchant maritime might; a functioning, 1940s-era merchant cargo vessel that served during World War II and the Korean and Vietnam wars. Visitors experience virtually the entire ship, including radio and gyro rooms, hospital, galley, weaponry, flying bridge, wheelhouse, officer and crew messes, engine room, crew cabins, chartroom and cargo equipment The developing museum contains photographs of the American Victory and other period merchant ships, U.S. Merchant Marine uniforms, personal recollections of life at sea as well as navigational equipment, hands-on displays and weaponry.



FL. Seventy-five years later it is this southern campus that continues the traditions established in 1933.

St. Petersburg, once declared "America's healthiest place to live," is the home of many treasures. It holds a Guinness

Coral Sea Div. Sea Cadets Change of Command

LCDR Shelby J. Gaul has stepped down as commanding officer of the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps,

Coral Sea Div., in Pomona, Calif. Lcdr. Gaul cited medical reasons for the 10 January 2010 change of command.

The change of command ceremony was held during the division's regular drill. The Unit is now commanded by Lt.

Robert Dickson. Lt. Dickson lives locally in the City of Upland and is a former Sea Cadet Corps associate regional director.

One of Lt. Dickson's goals is to eventually reactivate

the former Navy Leaguer Training Ship T/S Ingersoll named after the destroyer USS Ingersoll (DD-

652/990). It had become inactive in the late 90s due to losing her commanding officer. The Navy Leaguers are youth ages 10 to 14 who are interested in the sea service and who "feed"

into the Sea Cadets as they turn 13 or 14 years old. Lt. Dickson is the former commanding officer of the

San Bernardino Division of the Sea Cadets prior to becoming the associate regional director in charge of recruiting.

Lcdr. Gaul will be added to the Retired Officer Corps and can still assist with staffing future NSCC

trainings, as well as keeping a close association with Coral Sea Division and T/S Ingersoll. His plans include attending the next Coral Sea Reunion in Tampa, Florida in October, providing his health improves to allow travel.
