

Guantanamo Bay, Cuba was our destination from home port, Norfolk, VA. April through May 1954 was to be a standard shakedown cruise due to some repairs and upgrading in certain areas.

enlisted men. This would be a real treat for the crew!

The following morning it was in our Plan of the Day "The Coral Sea Breeze": Liberty will commence at 0900 for port and starboard liberty. Starboard side was highlighted so there would be no mistake of who goes first. Caution Notice was also given to the choice of beverages: "To be safe: Do not drink any rum that has lower than 4 stars on the label."

I went ashore around 1000 with a few mates from my division (3^{rd}) . We didn't go too far into the town as the temperature was in the 90's.

After a couple of hours, I decided to return to the ship. My buddies felt the same as I did. On the way back the road was blocked with open trucks carrying sailors who were either handcuffed or tied up with rope. They were all dead drunk. The Shore Patrol was keeping this caravan in an orderly fashion and making sure no one would escape. We had a good time watching this small caravan crawling down the road, but our entertainment wasn't over yet.

As we got aboard there was a Swap Team (3 or 4) lowering a work shirt or an old pair of shoes or some other item from the fantail of the ship down to a small rowboat. In return a bottle of rum was pulled up. Scuttlebutt had it that it was "a good day for trading". The Master at Arms caught them all red handed with about 4 cases of rum and it wasn't the 4-star variety.

On the aft-starboard side, young boys were diving for coins. They were expecting at least a 25-cent coin and got mad to find out some wise guy was tossing washers into the water. When a boy came up with a washer, he would throw it back at the coin thrower club.

In the meantime, word was put out to those still on shore: "Liberty canceled. All personnel report back to the ship immediately." When all the crew were accounted for the captain's announcement was made. "Make ready for getting underway". So, it was back to Guantanamo Bay and more training. As it was my last cruise, I was hoping all would go back to normal. My enlistment time was going to be up in a few months. What a surprise I got!

Thinking back on this episode in my life I thought that maybe the "Four Star Rum" wasn't really Four Star, maybe it was only One star! After all, who could tell after having a few shots of rum too many; no matter how many stars were on the label. Maybe the Captain was thinking along those lines too because a couple of weeks later, the Coral Sea Breeze posted some good news. We were going to Pier 87 in N.Y.C. at the end of our Cuban maneuvers. This is not the end of my story. In my next and final last installment of all those sea stories you will see why I saved the best for last. A real-life experience which I cannot forget, ever. Until then, smooth sailing and God's blessings on us all, fellow shipmates. Fair winds and calm seas to all.

could hear people talking in the background. At one point I heard a comment to turn a few degrees to port and I noticed the ship made a slight turn to port. I listened for a couple more minutes and then told the Air Boss that I thought I knew what the problem was, and I would go check it out. I went to the bridge and asked where the captain's hand radio set was. He pointed it out to me. I quickly realized that it had been laid down in such a way as to actuate the transmit button. This radio system had about 20 radios in it, and designed so that when one person transmitted, everybody else was locked out. When I picked up the captain's hand set the system reset and it was fully operational.

I contacted the Air Boss and informed him that the system was up and operational. He told me that he would see me NOW. I explained to the captain what had happened and then went to see the Air Boss. He wanted to know why I had given the captain a radio handset. I explained that I was in no position to tell the captain that he could not have one of them. While the Air Boss agreed with me, he was still not pleased. During the time Captain Peck was

aboard I was able to establish a good relationship with him and have always considered him to be the best Captain I served under during my 22 years.
