

I do recall being a little amazed that we were technically at sea...well, sort of, as we were in Puget Sound and I could feel no movement. But Puget Sound was like glass.

However, I doubt anyone will forget our weekend port-o-call in Vancouver, B.C. Our open house and hanger deck dance were so well attended, they had to shut down the festivities. The guests came aboard Coral Sea, but wouldn't leave! If you were manning the rails on the flight deck when we went under Lions' Gate Bridge entering Vancouver, as I was, you should recall our utter amazement at the crowds of people on the bridge and along the levees entering the harbor. They were there to see the largest ship (by a third!) and only aircraft carrier to ever enter Vancouver harbor!
