Our tour will be Friday, 6 October, beginning at 10 a.m. The cost is \$30 per person and includes round-trip bus transportation from the hotel.

During the 1980's the U.S. Navy realized that keeping its last remaining World War II Essex Class aircraft carrier in service was becoming too expensive and that the USS LEXING-TON should be replaced by a more modern ship. In 1990, the Secretary of the Navy announced that the USS FORRESTAL would replace the USS LEXINGTON as the Navy's training car-

Given Corpus Christi's long history with the Navy and naval aviation in particular, a task force was formed to bring the "Blue Ghost" to the city. The city council endorsed a \$3 million dollar

bond sale to finance the project. Although in stiff competition with several other communities, LEXING-TON was awarded to



the Corpus Christi team.

On 29 January 1992, LEXINGTON arrived at Naval Station Ingleside and became a permanent Texas resident. On 17 June she was towed to her final berth on North Beach. From the very first day of operation as a naval aviation museum, the USS LEXINGTON has remained totally selfsufficient! The Mu-

seum has relied solely on revenues generated from grants, donations, admissions, ship's store sales, special events, and the youth overnight program.

These revenues have covered all expenses not only to operate and maintain the ship but also to fund all capital improvements as well. Continue your Navy adventure...tour the USS Lexington at our 39th Annual Reunion.

Wake Island is a small island about a mile long and wide found in the south central Pacific Ocean. Lo-

cated on the island was an airstrip large enough to facilitate carrier planes and serve as a fuel depot.

In December 1941, shortly after the attack on Pearl Harbor, the Japanese assaulted Wake Island with carrier planes and hun-

dreds of land forces. Our courageous marines fought desperately to hold this island against tremendous odds. Our marines were estimated to be outnumbered at least 100 to 1.

A U.S. warship convoy was already

sailing toward Wake Island. It had already engaged in enemy dog fights lasting less than an hour before the enemy withdrew their aircraft.

Our warships were still far away from Wake Island, and our gallant marines fought on. They were never de-

feated, but were so badly outgunned they had to watch the

Japanese flag being raised on Wake. Also, our marines had expended virtually every resource on the island and had no way to replenish their ammunition and weapons.

The U.S. convoy of warships continued on toward Wake when, suddenly, our radio operators began

screaming throughout the ship, "Abort mission! Abort mission! Abort mission! All ships abort

mission now!" All ships immediately corrected to a more easterly heading.

The yardarm signal lights were also flashing the same message:

a.-__ b___... o____r._. t-_
m__ i.. s... s... i.. o____
n__. The message was flashed over and over, then after 6 repetitions, the signal lights flashed a

long "i.. x-..-" which means "execute immediately."

Every person on board, from Admiral down to seamen, were asking, "Why, why, what about our marines?" Officers and enlisted alike were overcome as this question was repeated throughout the night with no answer. Compliance with this order was never in question, however.

To minimize escalating rumors, a reasonable explanation had to come quickly. The convoy commander soon revealed the reason for

the decision: "Everyone and everything on the island had fallen into enemy hands and further effort to save them would be futile."

Most of us never learned the complete truth. Rumors were that Wake Island had no survivors. All U.S. equipment had been destroyed. And that the convoy com-



But why would Japan be so concerned about this tiny island? Geographically, it was very important because it was only about 500 miles from the Japanese occupied Marshall Islands, and within aircraft bombing and strafing range. Controlling Wake Island was simply a matter of removing this threat from the north.

The U.S. again regained control of Wake Island in 1945.
